


NEWSLETTER FOR SIDMOUTH PRIMARY SCHOOL

This Week's Story

Ministers have confirmed plans to ban the use of mobile phones in English schools and have released guidance for headteachers. The guidance is not statutory and offers school different ways of introducing the ban. These include an order to leave all phones at home, handing them in on arrival, keeping them in inaccessible lockers or allowing pupils to keep them on the condition they are not used or heard.
